Our service block is 30 weeks per year and maximizes time on-site when students are at school. During school holidays, clinicians receive their required professional development through the Strength Psychology clinic.

Cost Considerations of Self-Recruitment

\$120,889 - School Psychologist full-time fee
\$108,621 - Provisional Psychologist full-time fee
- as per CECV Enterprise Agreement October, 2020.

\$2100 per day - Private Psychologist on-site full day fee. Based on APS Recommended fee of \$300

\$300-\$500 per week - Clinical supervision cost for provisional and early career psychologists.

\$2745 - Purchase cost of WISC-V Cognitive Assessment kit. This is just one of many tests Psychologists purchase.

\$1500 - Annual Professional Development cost for Psychologists. Psychologists are mandated to complete 30 hours of professional development annually.

Did you know?

Provisional Psychologist's can't be employed without an approved program and oversight from a board-approved supervisor. Further, clinical supervision is mandated to occur at a 1:17 hour ratio. Schools can get caught out by not factoring in the costs of external clinical supervision and the costs of purchasing assessments.

Unsupervised clinicians can make costly ethical and legal mistakes.

Schools may not have existing policies and procedures and budget time or money for these to be developed.

Additionally, schools are often paying external professionals and facilitators to give consultation and training.

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
